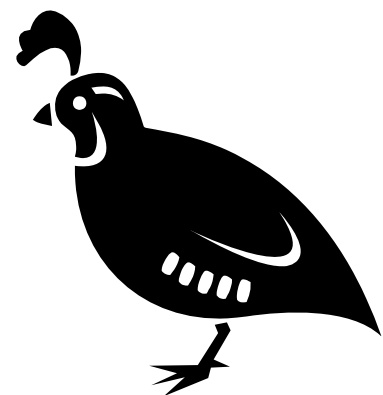

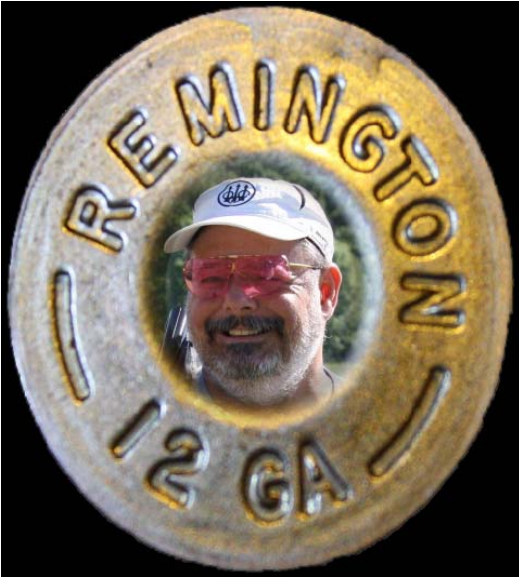

What Does It Take?

Recently, I saw on one of the online shooting forums a topic that was entitled “DESIRE, TIME & MONEY” and it basically was talking about what it takes to be at the top of skeet shooting. Is it just these three things or does it start with just these three things? A better question would be “Are these the correct answers to getting to the top?”

In the forum, they were talking about the average human being, not those who can't have their vision corrected or have physical problems, etc., preventing them from being one of the best. What if some people were just gifted in shotgun shooting and they are automatically better than most? Those shooters are referred to as “natural shooters” because they just have the natural ability to point a shotgun and break targets or hunt various birds. There are many different scenarios that we can discuss, but let's try to stay focused on the topic...what does it really take?

As mentioned above, there are some people who have natural abilities and can be good at certain things without having to put forth plenty of effort. I have a really good friend at home that can just pick up almost any musical instrument and find a nice melody or can watch someone else play a tune and pick it right up and not miss a beat. I have seen shooters in the same way where they can just point a shotgun without taking much effort and break targets. Is this the case for all of the top shooters in this league? No. Not even close.

Next time you see the top shooters, think about how many countless practice rounds they have shot and hours they have trained to get to where they are today, not to mention how many hours of practice and training it takes to stay on top of their game... It doesn't happen overnight, it doesn't happen in a month, most of the time it takes years! Still to this day, I am still coming up with new ways to train and make my game better (after 18 years of shooting)... If you ever get to the point where you stop learning, you are not going to get any better. Einstein once said, “Insanity is doing the same things over and over again expecting a different result.” I have used this quote before, but it is so very true.

We cannot stop learning when we shoot, otherwise we will not improve. Keep in mind, improvement doesn't necessarily mean higher scores, it means better execution. Hold on a second, how in the world can you improve your execution without improving your scores? Think about that for a second..... If you improve your execution on shots, what will automatically take place? Your

scores **overall** will begin to increase, that's why they call it an average. In other words, put your focus on the execution and let the scores take care of themselves! When you put your focus on scores instead of execution that is when two or three targets get by you because you aren't focusing on the next shot (you are worried about your score).



Ok, so if the top shooters have to work their way to the top, what separates them from the rest? Well, now that we are on the same page and understand that the guys at the top have to work and work very hard, we can discuss what they have to do to stay there.

First, I think the thread is correct when they say **DESIRE**. For most of us, the desire is pretty easy to find, you just have to know what you are looking for. You know what you want to do with this sport and not everyone is the same. Some of us want to be at the top, some want to win their classes, some want to be on the All-American team, some just want to have fun, etc. There is nothing wrong with any of these desires, so start by establishing what you want.

TIME is another essential factor because no one can achieve any of these goals overnight. However, some shooters do have more natural ability and can achieve their goals faster than others, but it still takes time. Also, when I mention time, I am not talking about how many years you have been shooting, but how much time have you put in on the **PRACTICE** field... Some shooters may have been shooting for 30 years, but have not spent much time on the practice field during their 30 years... Others have done 30 years of shooting in just 10 years (because they practice for countless hours)!

Another key factor that goes with time is **PATIENCE**! It is in our human nature to watch someone who is good at something and want to be like that person. Is it really realistic for someone who has been playing golf for 6 months to expect to be as good as Tiger Woods? Absolutely not! Notice I didn't say **WANTS** to be as good as Tiger, but **EXPECTS** to be as good as Tiger. There is a huge difference in the two! Most shooters see the guys at the top and **EXPECT** to be there in a short amount of time—it is not going to happen. It takes plenty of desire, plenty of practice, and plenty of time & patience!

All of these various topics are essential to achieving your goals and this is where it all starts. Unfortunately, the forum is also correct in saying that it does take plenty of money to get to the top—but what sport doesn't? Any sport out there will require all of these topics to be at the top.

What Does It Take (Continued)

I will take it a step further and say that you also need to have good mechanics and a strong mental game. This is where you need to be sure you are not wasting your time on bad mechanics and focusing on the wrong things. This is where a coach will keep you on the right track and help you get those solid fundamentals which will keep you on top of your game. A coach is there to keep your mechanics in good form which will help you break more targets. If you do not have solid mechanics, what good are you really doing besides learning bad habits?

In order to be at the top of any sport, the final step after everything we have talked about is having a solid foundation to build on (the foundation being the desire, patience, etc.), and the standing structure is your mechanics and mental game. If you want to be at the top, it takes plenty of work for anyone—no exceptions!

Dining on The Road

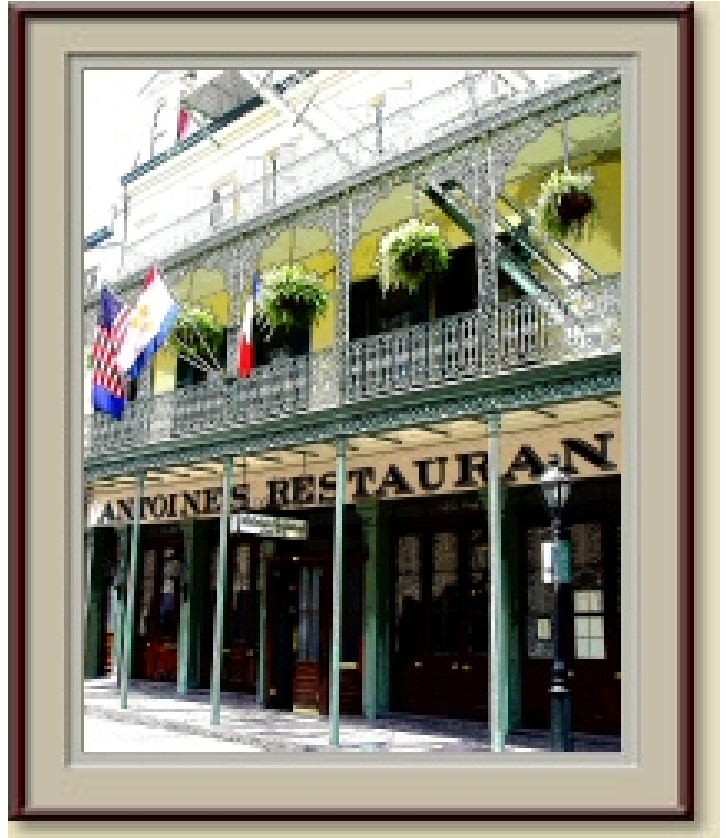
Antoine's, New Orleans

Recently, I had the pleasure of dining at what is reported to be the oldest family-run restaurant in the U.S.A. As a life long resident of Louisiana I was well aware of Antoine's Restaurant in the French Quarter. Somehow, I just never made it into Antoine's to dine. Antoine's was established in the Spring of 1840 by 27 year young Antoine Alciatore who had migrated to New Orleans from New York. This was at the time that New Orleans was the Queen of the Mississippi River, cotton was King and French gentlemen settled their differences under the oaks with pistols for two and coffee for one.

At its origins, Antoine's was a boarding house and restaurant called a pension. Within five years the Pension Alciatore was well established. The restaurant was so popular that it quickly outgrew its small quarters and moved down the street to its present location on Rue St. Louis.

After the death of Antoine, his wife took over the restaurant. His son, Jules Alciatore trained under his mother and later in France. After returning to America to be Chef of the famous Pickwick Club in 1882. His mother summoned him home to takeover at Antoine's. One of Jules' creations was Oysters Rockefeller which has often been imitated, although the actual recipe is a closely guarded secret.

The restaurant has remained in the family to this day and is responsible for a number of delicacies that are well known, including Oyster's Bienville (my personal favorite oyster dish), Eggs Sardou (poached eggs topped with artichoke hearts, ham, anchovies, truffles and hollandaise sauce) and Pommes de Terre Souffles (a very interesting presentation of puffed French fries). Then there is the Baked Alaska, which is a dessert that I have always wanted to try.

The restaurant has fourteen dining rooms, each with its own unique design and history. After our dinner, we were treated to a tour by our waiter. He walked our party through every dining room explaining the history of the restaurant and pointing out the many unique items displayed on the walls.

Antoine's is almost as much a museum as it is a fine dining restaurant. We even got to tour the kitchen.

The Soufflé Potatoes were an interesting appetizer. They were discovered by accident when French fries were prepared for visiting dignitaries who arrived very late. The fries were cold so they were dropped into very hot oil to reheat. The potatoes puffed up when they hit the hot oil creating a very light potato presentation which is hollow on the inside.

Oyster Foch is a fried oyster which is adorned with a brown gravy like sauce that was very similar (if not the same) as the Marchand de vin Sauce which was on the 8 oz Filet of beef. That filet was so tender you could cut it with your fork. It was an excellent steak. The creamed spinach and asparagus were also quite tasty.

I have always wanted to try Baked Alaska. I remember seeing that dish in movies. Well, the Baked Alaska was definitely a fitting ending to a fabulous meal. This Antoine's original dish is made by surrounding a core of ice cream with slices of pound cake which is then iced with whipped cream that is toasted (I assume with a torch). The waiter said there were no calories (at least he wasn't counting them) in this dish. I am sure that was quite a stretch.

Our waiter told me that Antoine's served an average of 1,000 Baked Alaska dishes a day. That must keep the pastry chef very busy.
